The meeting was turned over to President Jim Harrington. The invocation was given by Sawyer Wolston. President Harrington introduced the new officers of the association.


Mr. Don Cole introduced Mr. M. E. King and Mr. J. F. Burke, officials of Sinclair Koppers, the host for this meeting.



We, the By-laws committee, recommend that Article III be amended by adding two paragraphs to Section 2 and add ex-officio to the present paragraph.

First paragraph to read as follows:


"Past presidents in good standing who have served two year term, or two consecutive terms since January 1, 1968, and are not up for retirement, shall automatically become ex-officio members of the Board."

Second paragraph:

"The ex-officio members shall serve only in an advisory capacity, and there shall not be more than two such members; when a third member becomes eligible to serve, the senior member shall automatically be replaced."

Third paragraph:

"The executive Board shall consist of the officers, Board of Directors and the two ex-officio members of the Board."

He went on to say that this letter was produced by the Firemen and Fire Marshall's Association of Texas. Kenneth Baker of the Port Neches Fire Department was appointed by President Harrington to perform in this capacity.

Johnny Cormier requested that one-day schools be held for volunteers sometime after the first of the year. Dub Davis also expressed approval.

George Adams announced that he knew of a small community in need of a fire truck. He asked that anyone knowing where such a truck could be located to please contact him.
