Recent emergencies were discussed.

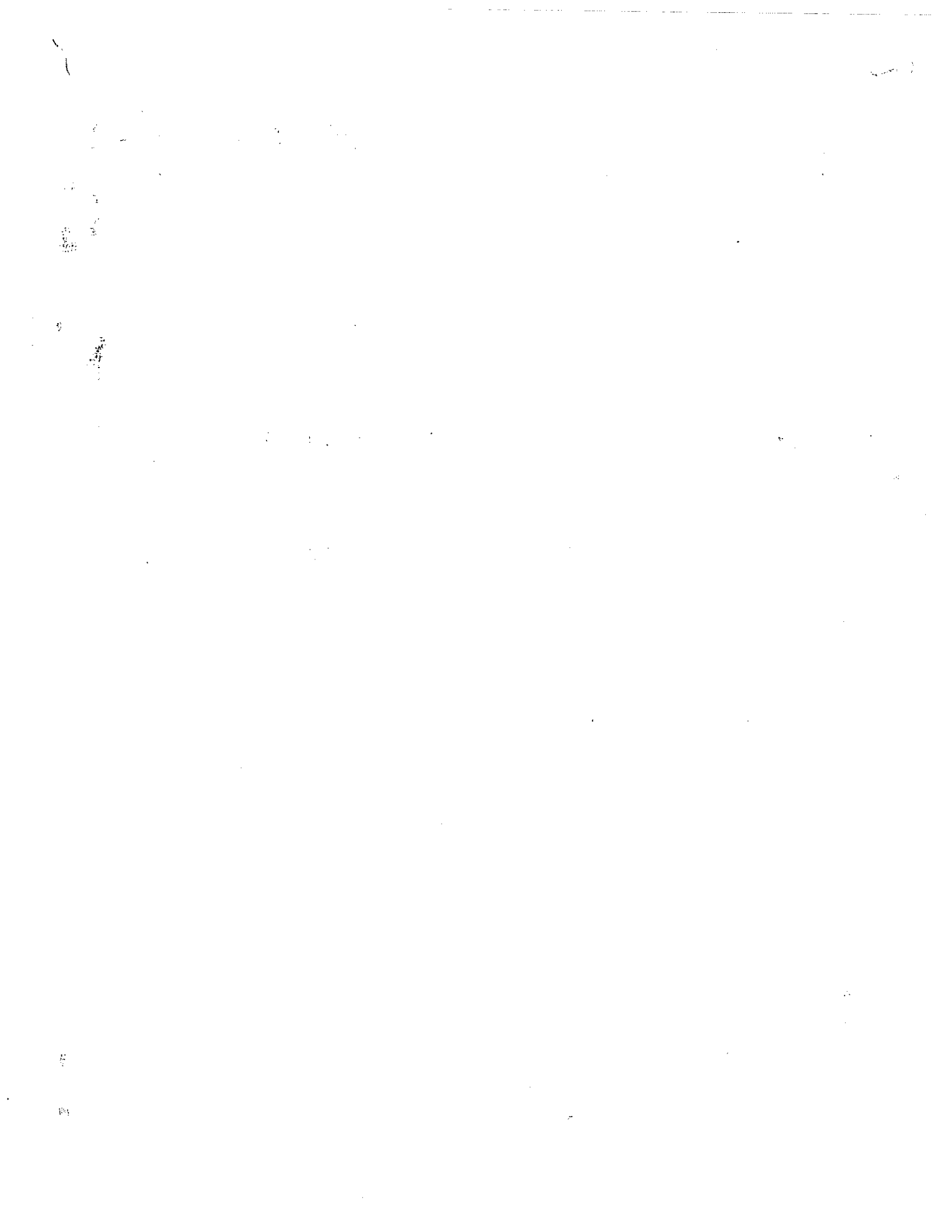
Tommy May introduced Charles Clary from Television Consultants as the guest speaker. Mr. Clary showed a film on his company, that explained the training films his company can make.

Bob Whitehead read a letter of resignation from Rod Downie, who was transferred to Houston. Rod was awarded Honorary lifetime membership in the Sabine-Neches Chiefs Association. The new voting member for Gulf Pipeline Company will be Ed Lewis.

Honorary memberships were also awarded to Aubrey Dixon, Retired Beaumont Fire Department, and Fred Collida, Retired Port Arthur Fire Department.

Pete Shelton announced the field is ready for the Ansul School. Dan White said the Ansul projects are available for any school. Work sessions are scheduled for instructors for the Industrial School. Don Perry talked to representatives on a new diesel engine for the fire training. The engine will be installed before May.

The water reclamation project is being studied for the training grounds. This will help separate the water and oil. The water can be used over for fire fighting and 10 to 15% of the fuel can be recovered. Proceeds from this industrial are earmarked for the water reclamation system.

Bob Wood stated it is cleared with DuPont to get the cyclohexane fuel delivered for 35¢ per gallon. The fuel will be gauged throughout the school to determine the amount of fuel used during the school.

Troy Standley encouraged local industries to get their people registered. Two hundred people are already registered and the school can only accommodate 450 people total. To register your people call Jim Cozine at 838-8428.

Pete Shelton said the fire department would be holding a 30 hour Public Service Dispatcher School. There will be a \$40.00 fee to cover the cost of supplies. There will need to be a minimum of fifteen students before this school can be put on.

It was reported that the City of Beaumont cannot handle the project of the waste water recovery system. They must go out on a contract basis.

Tommy May stated all board members should be present at the news paper media meeting to discuss the same problems that were discussed with the television news media. The meeting will be Tuesday, July 13, 1982 at 12:00 noon at Moncla's.

Commander Halverson reported that the United States Coast Guard is still procuring equipment for the hazardous materials response team. The reason for such slow forming of this team is due to the lack of personnel transfers in the unit.

The Communications Committee announced that radios are being acquired for the ambulance frequency.

Bob Wood announced a meeting with oil companies concerning an off shore training facility in this area. This training facility needs a building sight, 600 - 900 pounds of high pressure gas, and new equipment tested and researched. The cost will be approximately \$350 per student for a two day school. The total project cost is estimated at \$100,000. Props which have been proposed include a helicopter pad fire, kitchen fire (galley), sump tank fire, blowout preventor, and several other projects.

Tommy May announced a Public Relations Seminar to be held September 25, 1982. This seminar will have representatives from the local news media. Cost per person will be \$15.

Pete Shelton announced that 887 students have been trained during the last quarter at the Lamar University Fire School. This totals approximately 11,000 student hours.

Les Williams reported that there were 63 people who attended the Boots & Coots Foam School. The school went very well and they will try to have a two day annual school.

The Red Adair Rescue Team has future plans to hold a seminar on rescue training. Cost will be \$25 per student during the month of July. A minimum of eight students is required.

Troy Standley announced that a volunteer certification program was started on June 26 in which 60 students attended. The next school will be held in August. Lamar University is offering four different courses in the up-coming fall semester in the Fire Protection Technology degree program.

A trooper from the Department of Public Safety talked on moving fire equipment from one plant to another. Emergency equipment may be moved during an emergency without a commercial license.

The Sabine-Neches Chiefs Association received a copy of the hazardous waste contengcy plan. This plan will be put on file with the Sabine-Neches Chiefs Association.



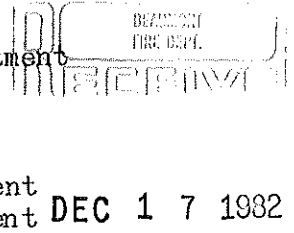
