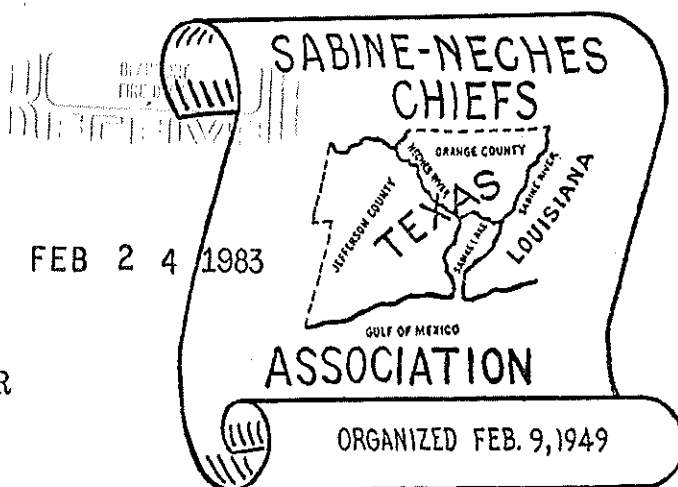

Invocation was given by Tommy May.

Gulf Chemical, Host Organization Representative Francis Lyons welcomed the group on behalf of the Site Plant Manager, Mr. Bob Walker. Mr. Walker later welcomed the group and expressed appreciation for the organization and its purpose.

Self introductions were made.

The minutes of association board members were read. (See attached) A motion was made by John Judice to accept the recommendations of the Board and was seconded by Dick Nugent. The motion carried unanimously.

In addition, the Board recommended that the organization donate \$500 to the Beaumont Fire Department to be used to assist in the costs of hosting the annual State Firemen and Fire Marshalls Association of Texas Annual Conference to be held in Beaumont on June 18 thru June 21. A motion was made by D. A. Bruce and seconded by Dick Culbertson to donate the \$500. Motion carried unanimously.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Pete Shelton reported on the action of the Lamar University Fire School Advisory Board. The 14th Annual School is ready. Brochures are prepared and being distributed. Enrollment is expected to be down

slightly but everything is ready. To date 20,000 gallons of fuel have been purchased at a cost of 54¢/gallon. More fuel, approximately 20,000 gallons, is still needed.

Bob Wood reported registration will be the same as last year, which includes registration for the week of school and lunch and coffee served on the grounds and during breaks.

Dennis Bruce reported that the grounds and equipment are in excellent condition. However, additional 1-1/2" fire hose and dry chemical fire extinguisher powder are needed from any who can donate.

Work is in progress on the water containment and clean up. Topo maps complete. Next lay out system. Put in sealed ditches and pumps. Donations will be needed as this work progresses.

Dan White announced that the Ansul schools scheduled for March at the Fire Grounds may be reduced in number as only 55 of the needed 70 students have registered to date.

Pete Shelton, Dick Nugent and Capt. Buck reported on progress on the organization's fire boat. Progress is good, but donations (cash) are still needed to buy items that can't be donated. Still need:

20 feet of 16" or larger carbon steel pipe and
4 flanges for the size pipe donated. Also need
2 butterfly valves of same size.

Joe Willey, Lamar University, distributed brochures for a one-day ammonia and chlorine emergency seminar to be held Saturday, February 26 at Moncla's in Beaumont. Registration is \$10 per attendee, to be paid at the door and covers seminar, lunch and coffee break. Registration starts at 7:45 A.M. Contact Joe Willey concerning number of people expected to attend so dinner may be prepared by Moncla's.

Nick Hill reported on the actions of a communication meeting held at Bridge City Fire Department to prepare a communication vehicle at that location. A second meeting is scheduled at 10:00 A.M. on February 16th at the Beaumont Fire Alarm Office.

In addition to this work, an update of the SNCA membership chart is in progress.

Recent emergencies were discussed. Special discussion centered on the recent tornado and severe weather experienced in the Beaumont area. It was stressed the need of staying off phones unless absolutely urgent and if you experience a "dead" phone during these periods it is probably "simply overloaded" circuits and not malfunctioning circuits. If you don't get a dial tone just wait, holding receiver in hand. When the overload circuits can give you a connection you will get a dial tone.

The program was presented by the Beaumont Police Department and was introduced by Sheriff Dick Culbertson. Capt. Crutchfield gave a very informative and interesting discussion of the use of dogs to detect various narcotics and the program of training and certification that dog and handler must follow.

Questions concerning the use of dogs can be answered by the Beaumont Police Department.

The meeting adjourned at 12 noon.

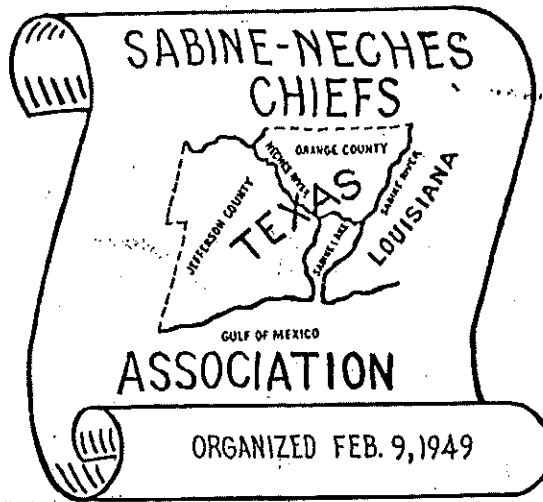

Les Williams and Bruce Davidson were made honorary members of the Sabine-Neches Chiefs Association by President Bob Whitehead.

Pete Shelton reported that two pipe welders from Gulf Pipeline are in the process of building a manifold with 18 inch pipe donated by Firestone in Orange. The manifold should be completed soon. Mr. Shelton also reported that two six-V 74 Detroit diesel engines are still desperately needed. Also, financial and material donations are still needed. So far, donations include:

Bob Whitehead reported that two 18 inch butterfly valves are needed very badly, along with further financial aid. The current balance in the fireboat account is \$11,755.57, which is not even enough for one of the two diesel engines needed.

Barney Singleton announced that a radar system has been donated for the fireboat.

Dennis Bruce reported that the training grounds are in excellent condition. Mr. Bruce also reported that work is being done on a waste water system in the Gulf. A tank donated by Pennwalt will be converted to a separator to separate the oil from the water.

Bob Wood reported that no diesel fuel has been found to blend with hexane at this time.

Commander Halversen reported that the trailer is almost completed. Also, there will be a two day Hazardous Materials Seminar will be held April 20 and 21. Further details will be handed out at the next meeting of the Sabine-Neches Chiefs Association, or you may call 724-4343.

Pete Shelton announced that only 87 people have registered for the fire school. Further registration is urged.

Bob Whitehead announced that a letter of addendum was received from Union 76.

Self-introductions were made.

Motion was made by Bill Roe and seconded by Dalton Abel to pay bills. All voted aye.

Jim Harrington reported on the Austin Conference.

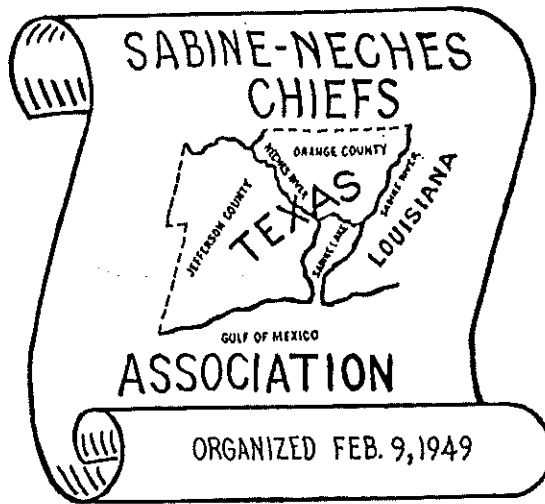

Minutes of the 406th meeting were read and approved.

Self-introductions were made.

FIREBOAT COMMITTEE

PETE SHELTON reported on the Sabine-Neches Chiefs Association Board of Directors meeting held at the Beaumont Fire Department Maintenance Shop. Results of the meeting are:

1. It was decided that a welder should be hired to finish the project.
2. Items that are badly needed should be purchased. This includes:
 - a. two engines
 - b. two storage tanks
 - c. flanges
 - 1) 6 4" 150 lb. Standard Flanges
 - 2) 4 8" 150 lb. Standard Flanges
 - 3) 4 10" 150 lb. Standard Flanges
 - 4) 4 12" 150 lb. Standard Flanges

BOB WHITEHEAD stated that financial and material donations are still needed in order to finish the fireboat. Among the material items needed are floodlights.

It was noted that GULF PIPELINE donated 1,200 feet of pipe to work on the fuel recovery system for the training grounds.

ED HARRIS of Arco-Polymer will donate electrical supplies for the boat.

GRADY BALDWIN stated that the present fireboat account balance is \$4,100.84.

AUDIT COMMITTEE

BILL ROE stated that the audit committee will give a full report at next month's meeting.

HAZARDOUS MATERIALS

The COAST GUARD is still working on the hazardous materials response trailer.

FIRE SCHOOLS

PETE SHELTON stated that 211 students have registered for the fire school in April. Also, the field is in good condition and instructors are ready.

CHIEF GUNDOLF reported that 4,000 pounds of Dry Chemical was donated by ansul, but an additional 3,500 pounds is needed for the school along with 130 cartridges.

The hazardous materials school, hosted by the COAST GUARD, will be held April 20 and 21, 1983 at the Coast Guard.

FRED MCALPINE announced that the Groves Fire Department will host the East Texas Firemen's and Fire Marshal's Convention April 8 and 9, 1983.

WALTER NEBGEN reported that there will be a Multi-media Instructor Training Course held at Red Cross in Beaumont on Tuesday, May 3, 1983.

BOB WHITEHEAD announced that there will be a Tank Fire Seminar at the Beaumont Civic Center on May 12, 1983.

RAY BROUSSARD of the National Weather Service stated that the Hurricane Strike Probability within 125 mile area of the possible landfall area will be given in percentages.


A letter was received from Mr. Turner of Arco in response to the fire at Arco.

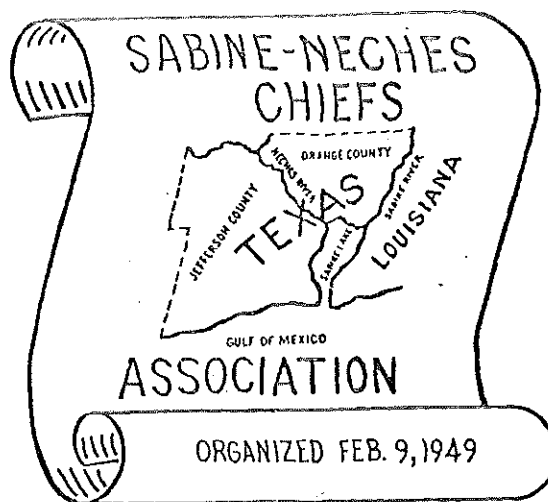

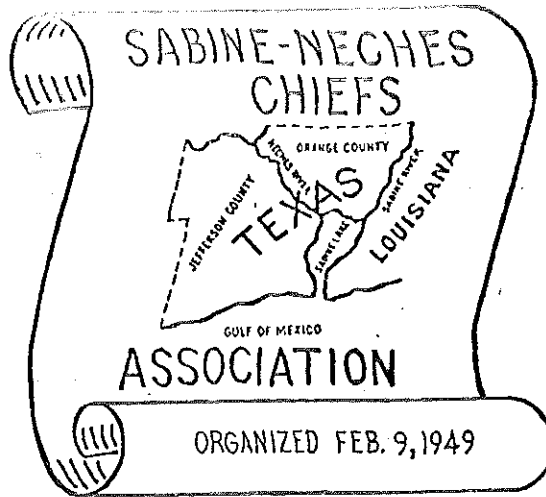

The 413th meeting of the Sabine-Neches Chiefs Association was called to order Wednesday, October 5, 1983, at 10:00 A.M. by President R. N. Whitehead at the Ramada Inn in Orange. A list of members and guests present is attached.

Invocation was given by Max Bradberry.

Host Organization, Allied Chemical of Orange, was represented by P. S. Harris who welcomed the group.

Self Introductions were made.

The membership was informed that an application for Associate Membership has been filed by The Beaumont Fire Extinguisher Service. The Board of Directors has not met to act on the request.

The meeting adjourned at 12:00 noon.

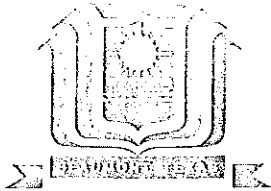

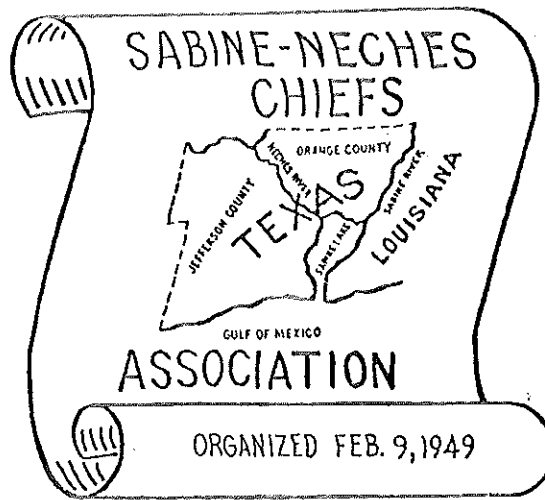

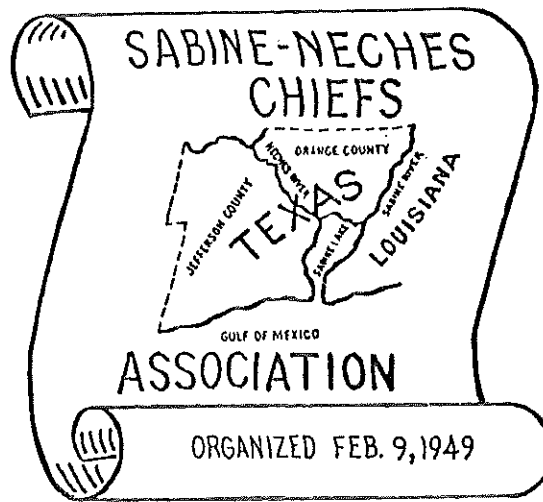
