# SUGGESTIONS FOR 1994 - 25TH ANNUAL FIRE SCHOOL


- 1. Appoint a conference chairman who is a member of SNCA, involved in fire protection, and current on new technology and regulations.
- 2. Submit a copy of fire school registration showing numbers in each class sections i.e., (firefighting, hazmat, rescue and large diameter hose), and expenses for the school. Also submit a recap of how the previous years profits were spent in field improvements.
- 3. Instructors absent, without an excuse prior to the school, will be omitted as instructors in the next years school, and will have to resubmit their names as instructors and be placed in pool.
- 4. Set-up a committee to review instructors, and make instructor assignments for 1994 school. Refrain from using too many instructors from one city or company, serving on the same project. Movement of instructors provides them with exposure to other ideas and techniques which improve them, and provides them with fresh approach to class instruction.
- 5. Each lead instructor must submit class outline and equipment list needed two months before annual school.
- 6. Have safety representatives and field chairmen inspect and review training field 2 weeks before annual school to identify work needed prior to work day and address safety concerns included in this review.
- 7. Repack water pump spray from outboard packing spraying on wall near switches.

- 8. Install larger or additional drain line from area north of chemical complex to pit east of hazmat.
- 9. Develop a process to blend off recovered fuel that permits better utilization and improved fires.
- 10. Segregate north landfill drainage from projects this would greatly reduce water being pumped and separated.
- 11. provide manifolds on city water main and field water system to permit the use of a back-up pump in event of fixed pump failure.
- 12. Improve the roadway to the river and provide drafting area.
- 13. The cottage (house) is in very poor condition. Consideration should be given to a replacement structure that would provide not only a cottage type fire environment but also may be used for office warehouse and manufacturing fires.
- 14. Established class times must be followed. Classes are being cut short the students should receive 50 min. of good training not only how to fire fight, but other items such as size-up, attack and real world hazards.
- 15. Review instructor list for projects. Some of the projects are staffed with as many instructors as they have students.
- 16. Develop a field piping map to show locations of lines, valves, tanks and etc.
- 17. Provide a fence or a barricade and a walk or crossover for the lpg and fuel lines between flat pit and loading terminal.
- 18. Provide check valves in fuel and foam lines to crude oil tanks.
- 19. Install back-up pump on firewater system. (A p. a. refinery is replacing some of their diesel driven pumps and may possibly donate)
- 20. Provide hand washing facilities (temp) to allow students to wash up for lunch and evening.
