
WHAT HAPPENED: The purpose of this memo is to alert other OFS employees to a potential home hazard with Smoke detectors. A recent stove fire in my home DID NOT set off any of the (3) three alarms. The kitchen and grand room were filled with the smoke from a Teflon covered utensil which had been left unattended in a pan that had just been turned on high. The toxic smoke from this burning was intense and visibly covered over half the home and was being recirculated by the AC unit. We smelled the fumes and got the problem handled with little damage other than the loss of a cast iron pan and utensil. The problem was why none of the smoke alarms had not done their job in alerting us of this hazard? The answer is simple but none the less perplexing.

CORRECTIVE ACTION / RECOMMENDED PREVENTION:

The batteries in all three alarms ëpush to testí great and make plenty of noise in doing so. I contacted the fire department in Slidell, La. and was advised that we investigate the age of the smoke detectors. It was recommended that I contact a company such as ëFirst Alertí and ask them about equipment utilization with age. My present detectors came with the home an are 15 years old. The people at First Alert mentioned that although the batteries test good with the alarm circuit, (on a push to test button) that if the units are seven (7) years old (or older), the actual sensor that detects the presence of smoke is most likely inoperative due to age, dust, grease and mineral build up. This is exactly what happened to ours. The only way to really operationally check your complete system is to have a fire near the detector to see if it responds. Since this is dangerous (under the best conditions), I suggest that any smoke detector

that is close to seven years of age be replaced. The new First Alert Systems we purchased cost about \$25 each and are worth every penny!!
