

2-DAY EOC'S ROLE IN COMMUNITY CYBER SECURITY AWR-136 & MGT-384

8:00am - 12:00pm Essentials of Community Cyber Security AWR-136

OVERVIEW: This is a four (4) hour non-technical introduction to cyber security. This basic awareness course will explore cyber security in a community context and demonstrate how cyber-attacks can impact, prevent, and/or stop business operations and emergency responses. It is an awareness level course for participants who are interested in how cyber can impact a community and what role everyone plays concerning this threat. This discussion-based course builds basic terminology, identifies fundamental cyber threats, vulnerabilities and countermeasures that can impact an individual, organization and community. **(4 hours total)**

Training Level: Awareness

Venue: Jurisdiction

Course Length: 4 Hours

Participant Audience: This is a pre-requisite course to MGT-384. Everyone enrolled in the MGT-384 course should also register in this AWR-136 course.

OVERVIEW: This non-technical course supports "Whole Community Response" and is designed to provide an awareness of how cyber events can impact a community, an Emergency Operations Center, and our daily lives. In this course, participants will discover the roles and responsibilities needed to detect, prevent, and respond to a cyber-security incident. Using past cyber events, participants will explore how Emergency Management and other community officials would plan for and manage information and resources needed for a cyber-event and understand how cyber can be used to affect, disrupt, and/or complicate emergency responses. **(12 hours total)**

Training Level: Management & Planning

Venue: Jurisdiction

Course Length: 12 Hours

Class Size: 40 participants

Participant Audience: Participants should be involved with any Emergency Operations Center (examples include: State, City, County, and University, Hospital, Critical Infrastructures or private sector). Participants involved in all EOC activities during a community emergency, disaster, or other events are encouraged to attend.
